Tamar Lichter Blanks is a Ph.D. candidate in mathematics at Rutgers University. Her research is in abstract algebra, a branch of mathematics that is about understanding symmetry and structure. Blanks is passionate about sharing the conceptual side of math – which she says is really a jumble of puzzles, patterns and logical thinking – and about helping people feel welcome in math and science in general.

Thalia Plata is a journalist based in Boston, Mass., who recently graduated from Emerson College with a B.S. in journalism and minors in history and political science. Originally from southeastern North Carolina, she is passionate about diversity in media, making news accessible to the general public and telling stories in an engaging way.

Vanessa Vieites, Ph.D., recently completed her doctorate in psychology with a specialization in developmental science at Florida International University, where she studied neurological and cognitive predictors of individual differences in young children’s learning and memory abilities. She also earned a minor in quantitative methods and a certificate in women’s and gender studies. But, she says, writing is her first love. Vieites feels fortunate to have been introduced to the AAAS Mass Media Fellowship, where she can combine her affinity for writing with her quest for knowledge and share both with others.
