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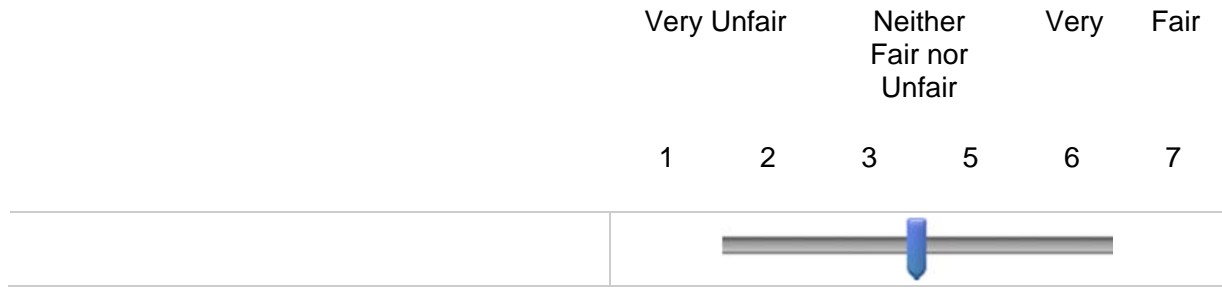

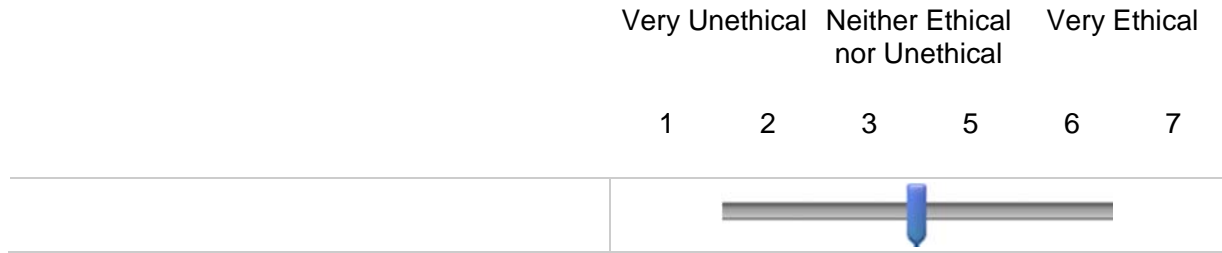
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Q4: How FAIR do you believe it is to donors that they receive no compensation for their plasma donations?

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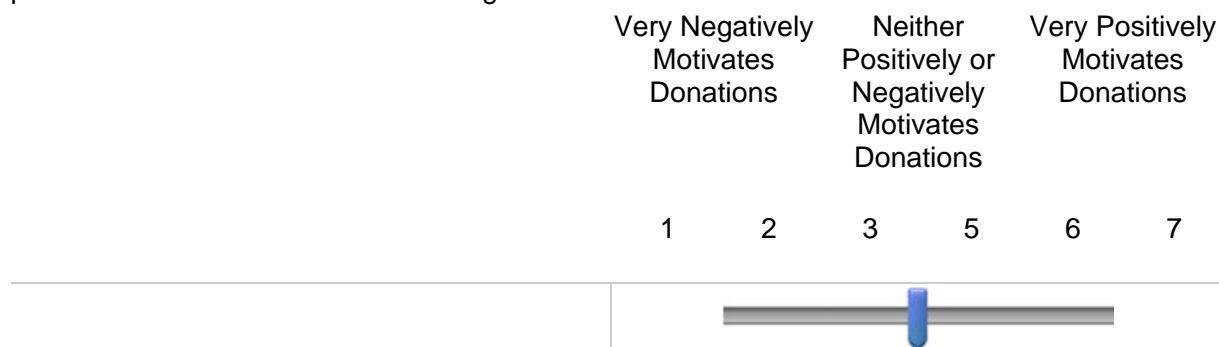
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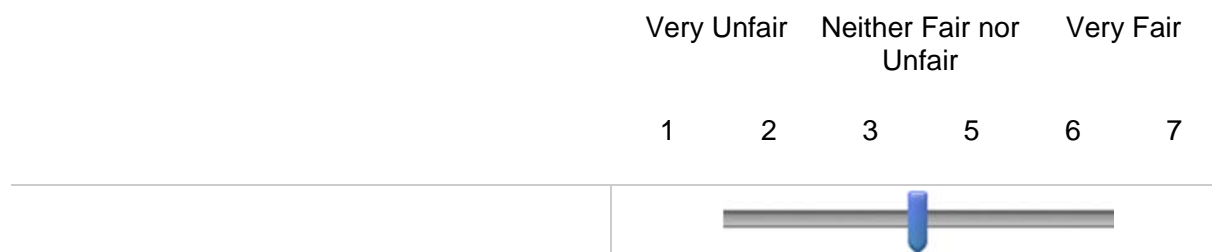
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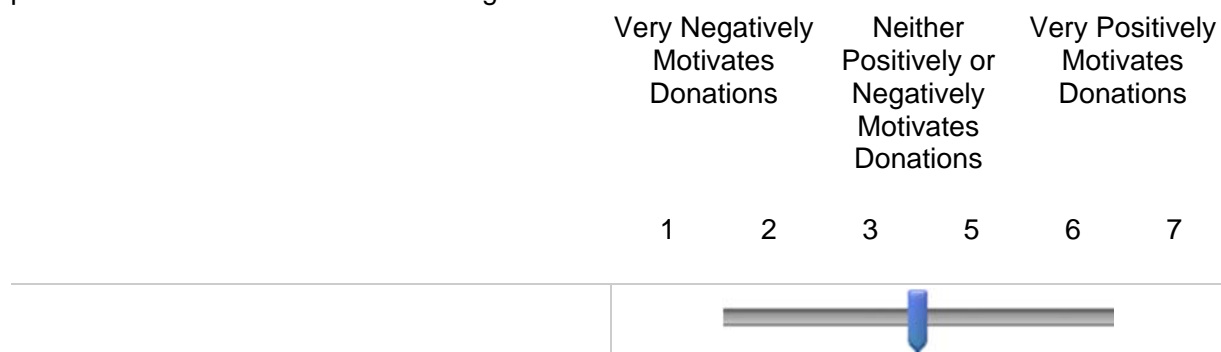
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**Survey Questions indicate compensation offered
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Donating Plasma: The entire time to make a plasma donation takes about one and one half hours at a collection centre, including about 45 minutes for the actual collection. During this 45 minutes, a staff member puts a sterile needle in a vein in your arm to draw blood. The blood is cycled through sterile equipment that separates plasma from other parts of your blood. Your plasma is then collected in a container, while the other parts are safely returned to your body.

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Rapidly growing demand for plasma Over the past decade, the demand for plasma has increased rapidly, and it is expected to continue to grow for many more years. To meet the growing demand for plasma, the Australian Government is now importing almost half of all plasma used in Australia from donors outside of Australia, and primarily this is coming from US donors.

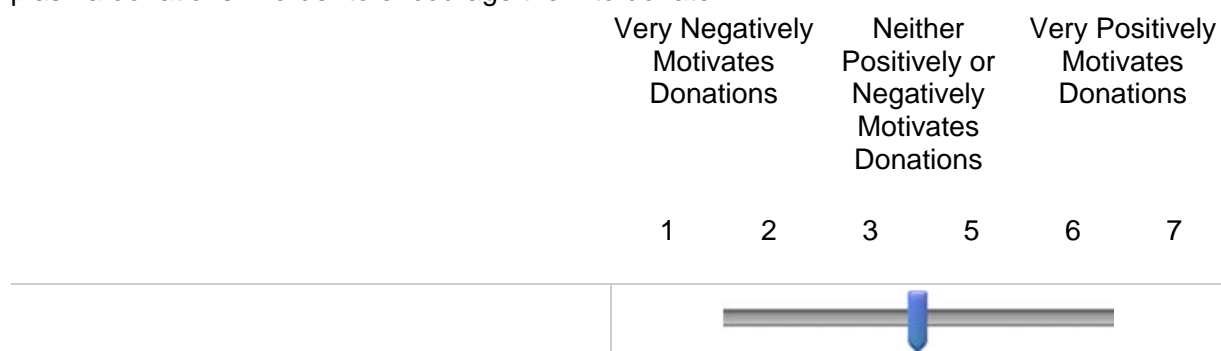
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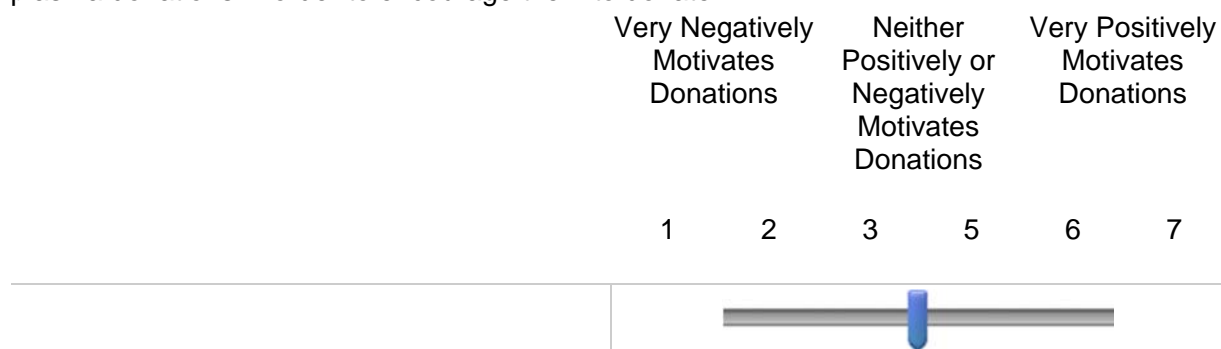
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
