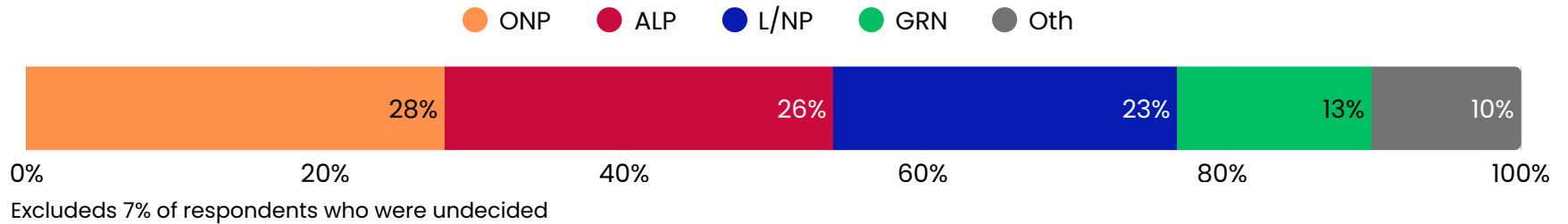

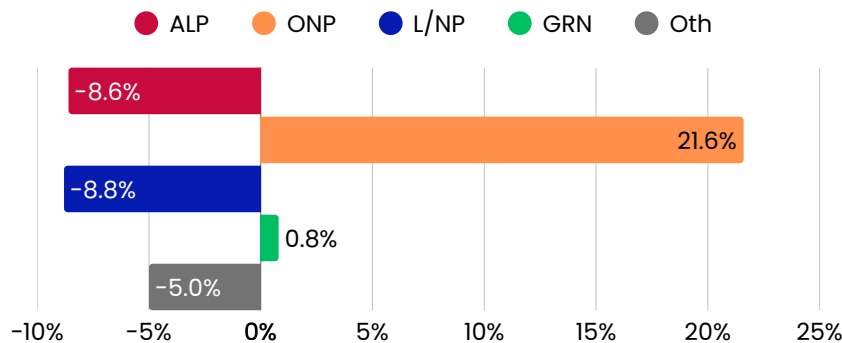
Primary Vote & Seat Projection



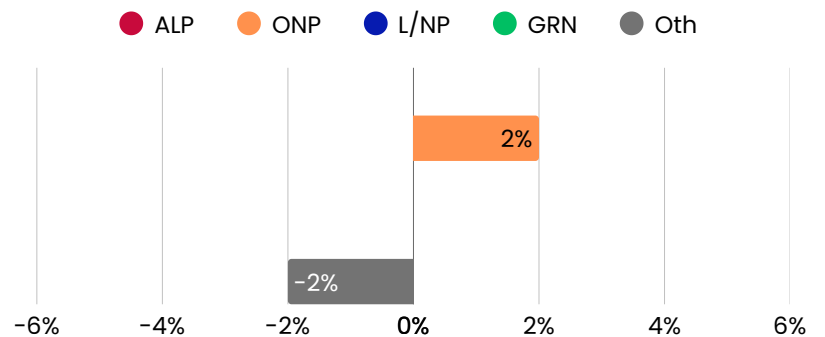
Primary Vote %

Swings Since Last Poll (Apr)



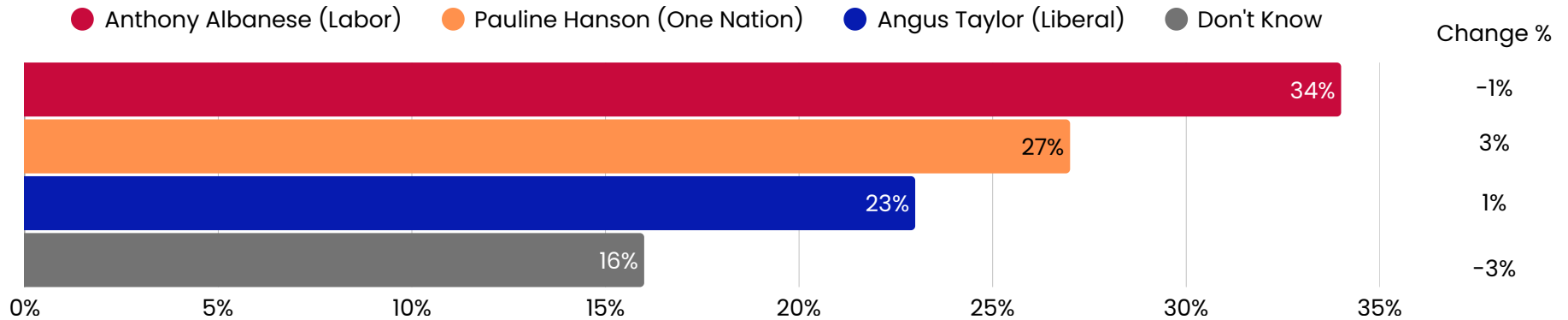

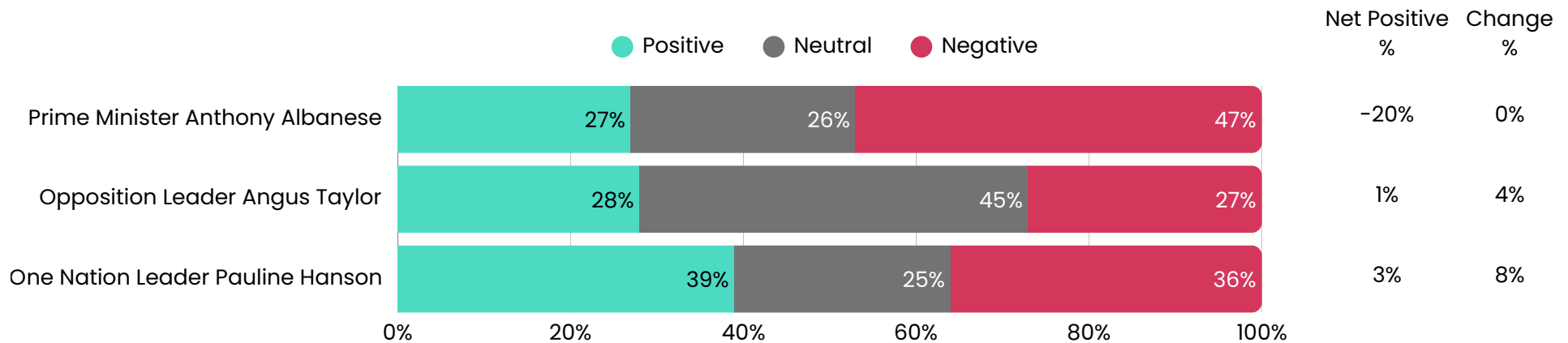
Preferred PM + Leader Ratings

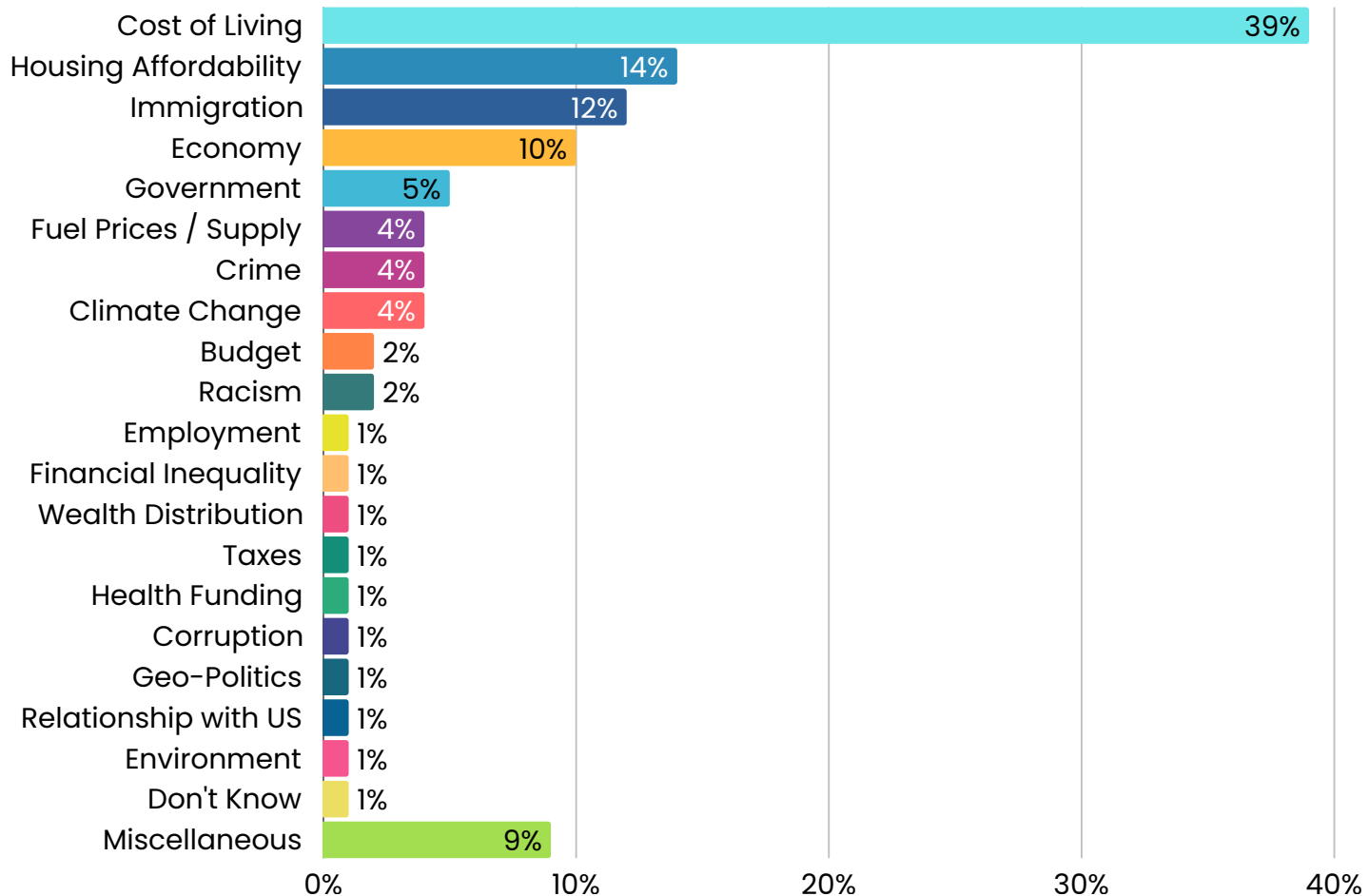

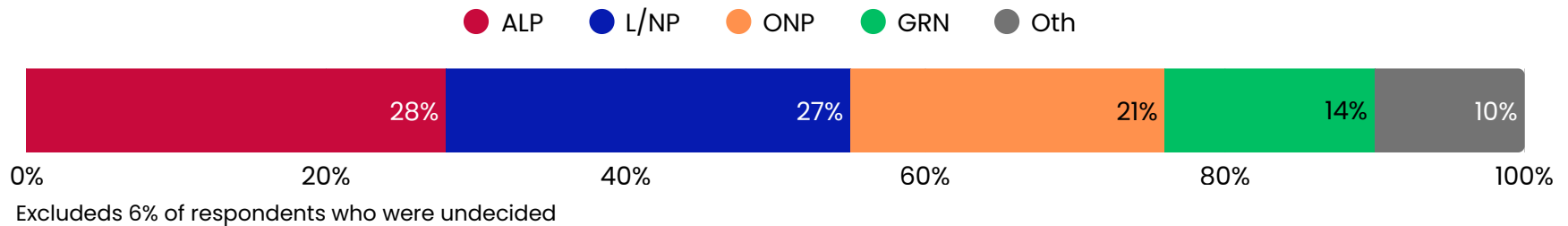

Primary Vote %



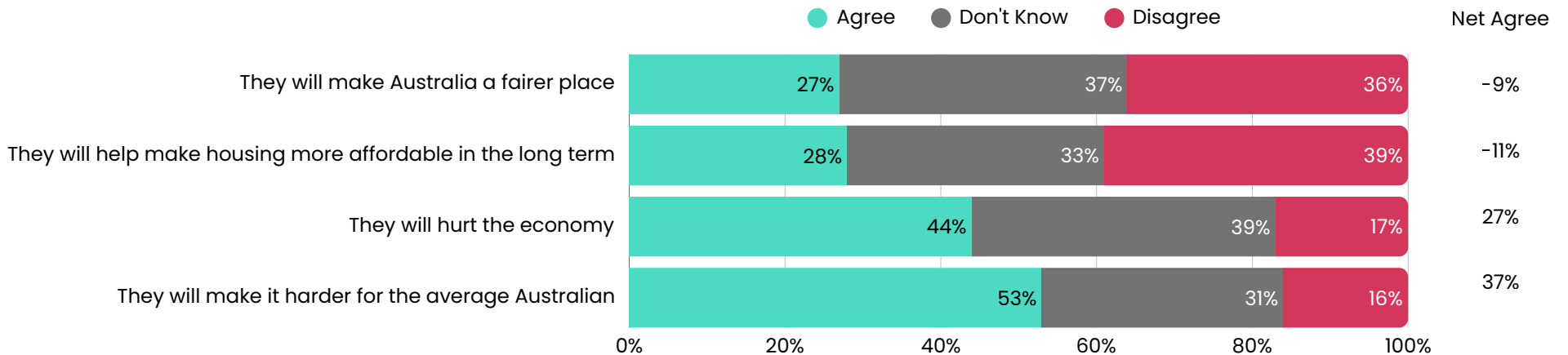

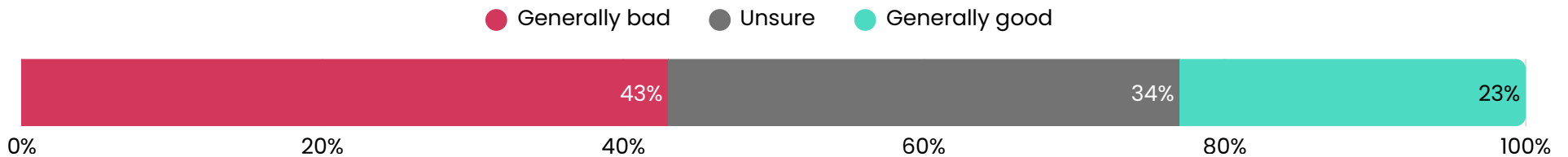

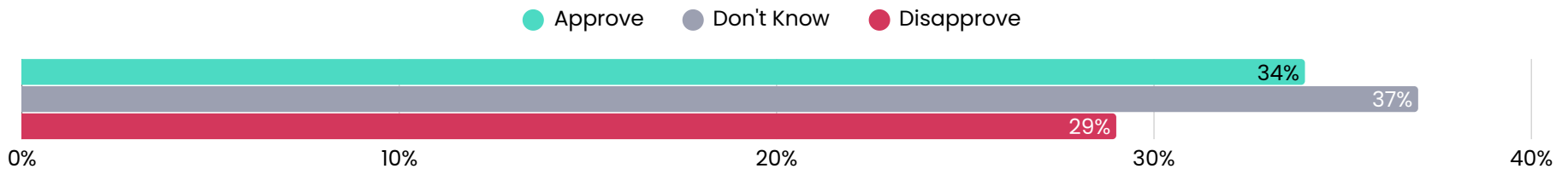

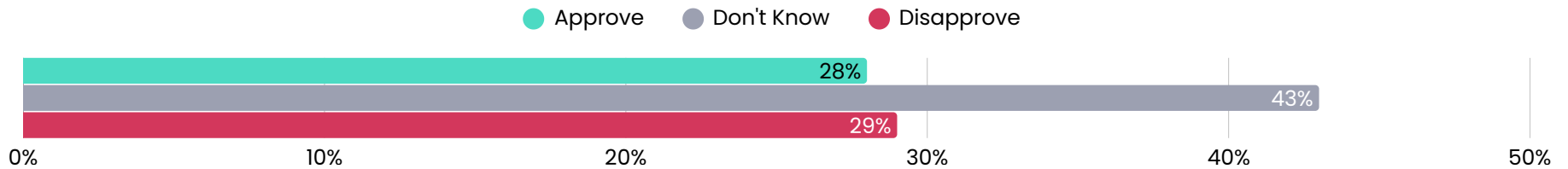

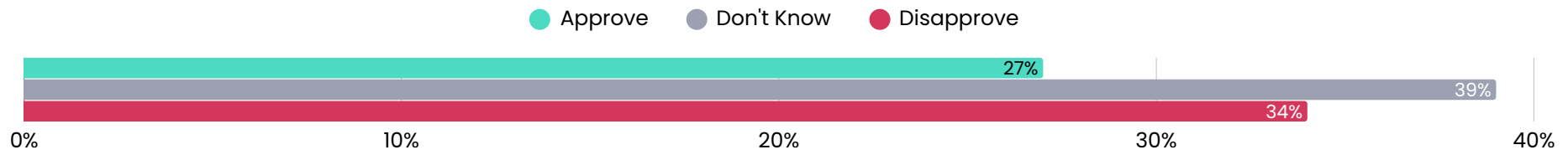

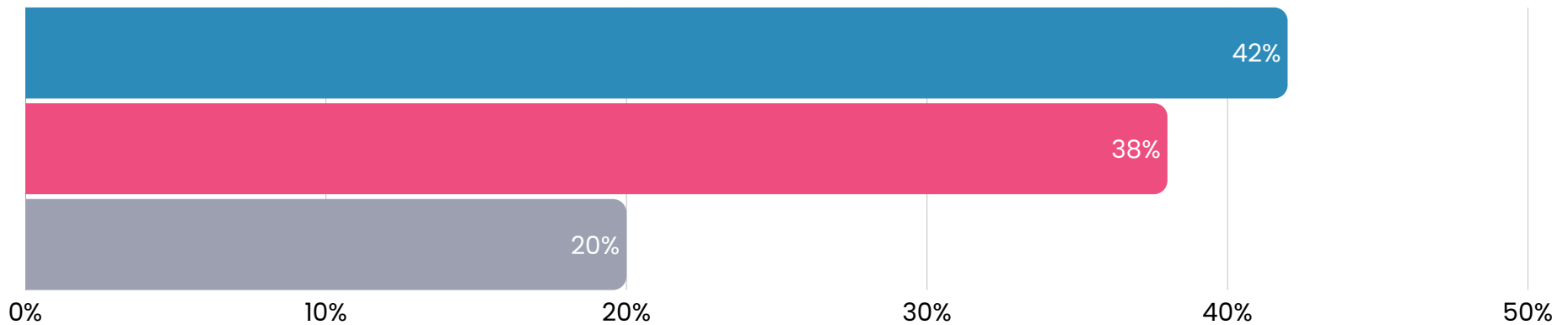

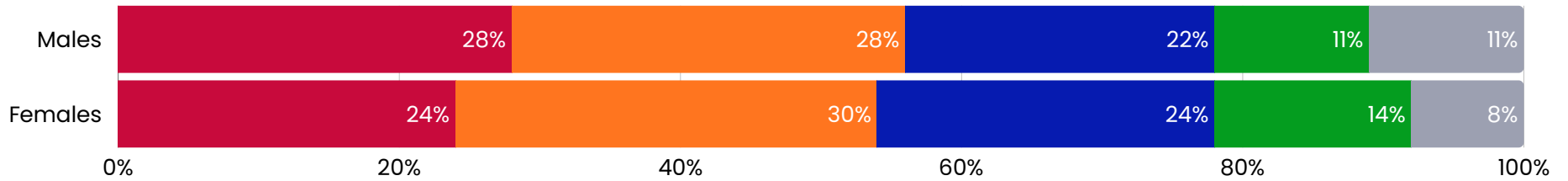

Voting Intention: Gender + Age



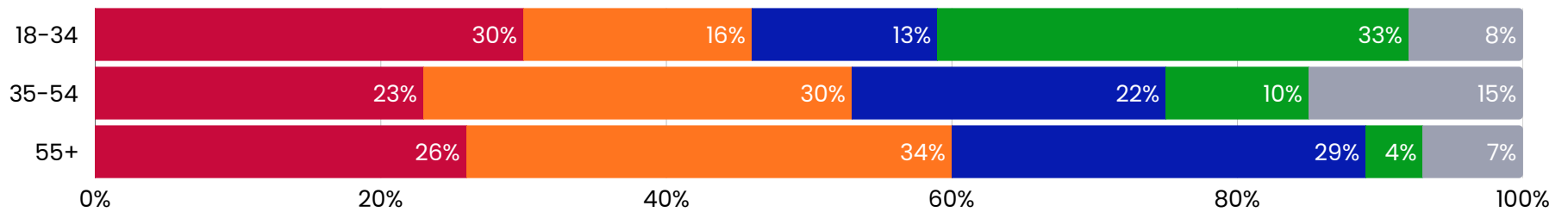

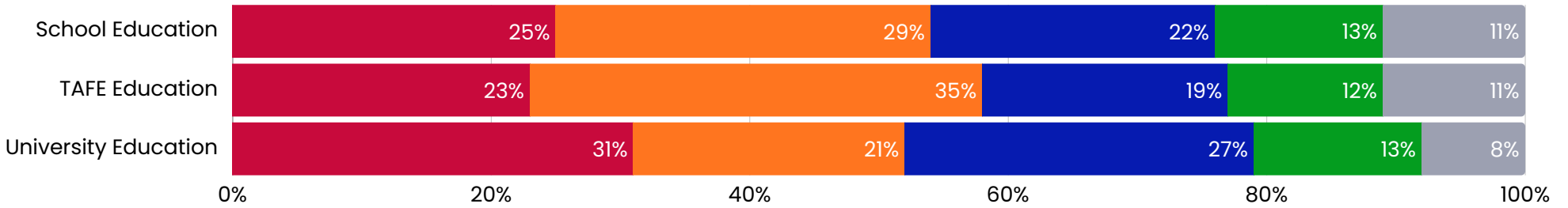


Education + Income



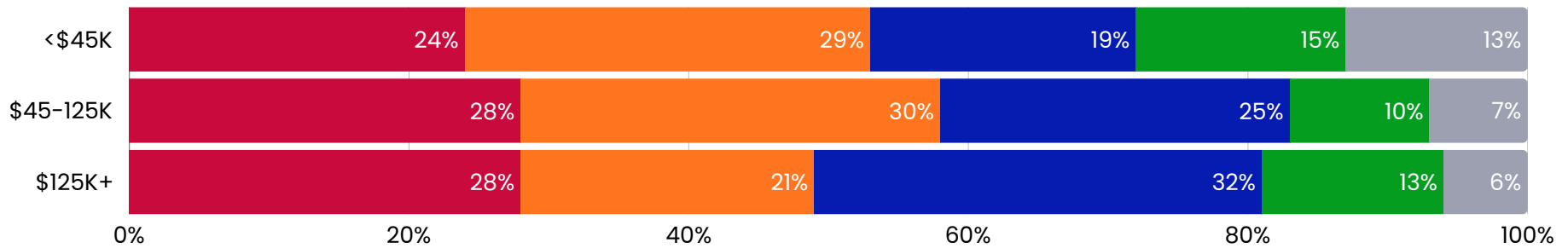

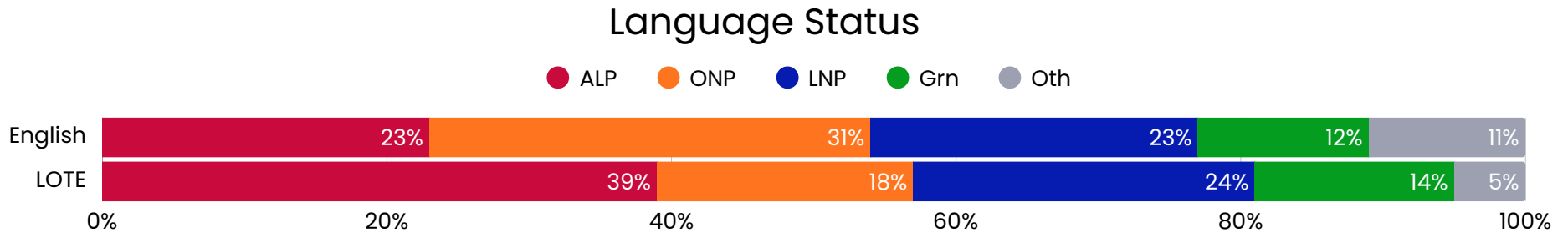

Voting Intention: State + Location

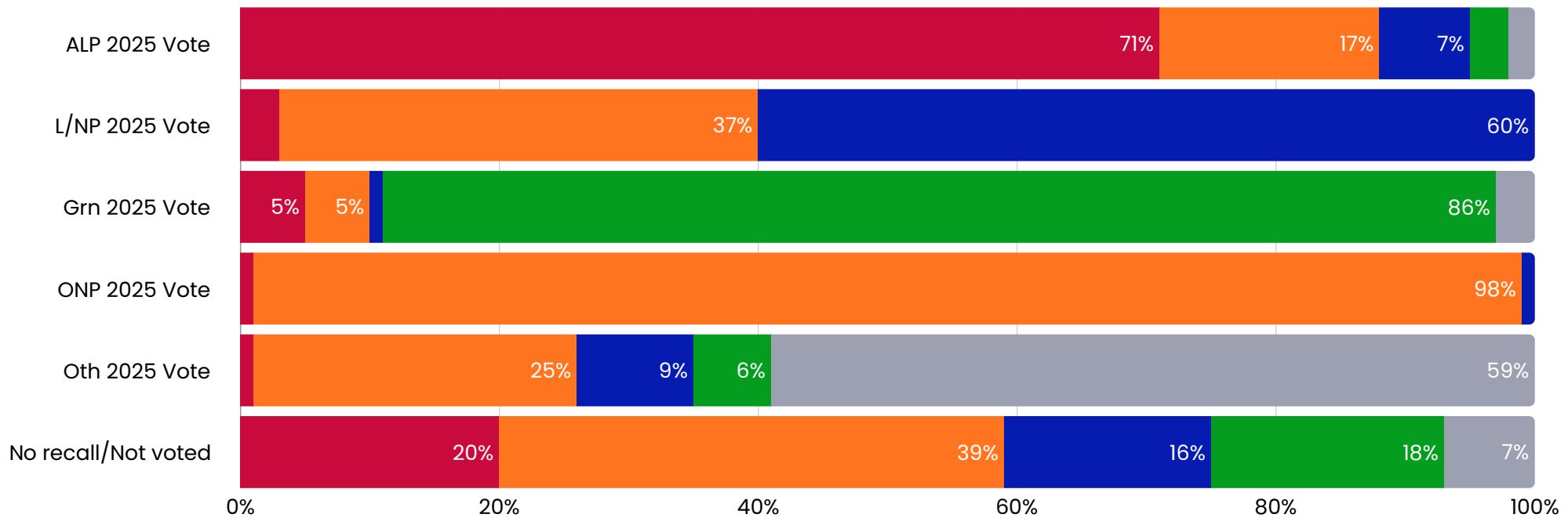


Voting Intention: Past Election Vote
